What Are You Planting?

I'm hoping some day to be more diligent about planting a garden. Carol and I have tried a few times through the years to grow some different vegetables and fruits—but only with limited success. While I am certainly grateful for the produce sections in the grocery stores, there's nothing quite like the taste of food right from the garden or farm!

I ran across an interesting piece several years back that I would like to adapt a bit in hopes it helps you with your faith pondering. The original was called "*Planting Your Spring Garden.*"

For the garden of your daily living, plant 4 rows each of...

Peas:	Peace of Mind	Peace of Heart	Peace of Soul	Peace in Relationships
Squash:	Squash Gossip	Squash Indifference	Squash Grumbling	Squash Selfishness
Lettuce:	Lettuce be Faithful	Lettuce be Kind	Lettuce be Patient	Lettuce Pray
Turnips:	Turnip for Worship	Turnip to Help Others	Turnip to Volunteer	Turnip for Lead
Thyme:	Thyme for Each Other	Thyme for Family	Thyme for Friends	Thyme for God

Water this garden freely with patience, and cultivate with love. There will be much fruit from your garden because you reap what you sow.

One of my favorite Bible passages is Colossians 3:17: "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." (NRSV) The thoughts above seem to echo this verse. Certainly something to ponder...





I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I think it's important to reflect Paul's words to the church in Ephesus offer us a rich picture of his desire for the church (both locally and globally) to growing ever deeper into intimacy with the love of Father, Son and Spirit. It is from the richness of his glory that all things come to us, and it is by the power of the Holy Spirit that we are rooted and grounded in love. This love is the love of Christ, and it is through the context of the local church we are connected to this love and called to be more deeply rooted and to grow deeper. It is not by our own power as individuals, but with "all the saints" that we begin to comprehend is "the breadth and length and height and depth and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge..." Knowing the infinite depth of the goodness and love of God is a communal act. Loving one another, praying for one another, forgiving one another; all these things are the ways in which the Spirit uses to grow us closer to each other and to God but also to be "filled with the fullness of God".

As we travail the uncharted winding roads ahead, let us remember Paul's prayer from Ephesians and also a prayer from St. Augustine:

"O God, in you there is no strife, no disorder, no change, no need, no death but supreme harmony, supreme clarity, supreme permanence and life."


After enjoying the food and some conversation, we'll play some fun games before we head home around 2:30 PM.


