

# A Few Words About Our Worship...

A Word of Welcome to our Guests: If you are visiting today, we say a special "Welcome!" to you. We want to do everything we can to make you feel like family! Please feel free to ask us any questions you might have about our congregation and ministry. If you live in this area and do not have a current church home, we'd be delighted to have you become a part of our congregation family at Ascension.

Name Tags & Worship Registration: As you look around, you will likely see a lot of name tags! That's because we encourage everyone to fill one out. (Name tags and markers are on the tables outside the Sanctuary.) We also ask everyone present to fill out a "Friendship Book" with their name, address, phone, and email—and to mark any of the boxes that apply to them. These books are usually distributed by the ushers at the beginning of the service. Thanks for taking a moment to do this! (Online worshippers should register on our website!)

**Open Communion Table:** Jesus tells us in the Bible that the bread and wine are His body and blood. While we cannot fully understand this mystery with our minds, we can take Jesus at His word and believe in our hearts that He is truly present in Holy Communion. In this gift, Jesus brings forgiveness of sins along with hope and strength for a renewed life to all who come to Him with a repentant and believing heart. We invite any and all baptized Christians who share this faith to join us at our Lord's table, including children who have received Communion instruction. You don't have to be a member here or belong to a Lutheran congregation. Simply share this faith with us that Christ is truly present in the Lord's Supper and come with your open and repentant heart to receive the gifts Jesus offers to us in this Holy Sacrament!



**Receiving Communion:** As you receive your piece of bread, please dip it into the wine which is in the ceramic chalice. For those who cannot have the wine, you can dip the bread into the glass of grape juice or just take the bread alone. (If you need a gluten-free option, just let the server know!) Individual cups are also available, with the grape juice in the center of the tray! (Empty cups can be dropped into the wastebasket.) If it will work better for you to receive Communion at your seat, please notify one of the ushers and one of our Communion teams will come to serve you there.

**Health & Worship:** As a caring faith community, we believe God calls us to do our part to lower any risks involved in public gatherings. For this reason, we have hand sanitizing stations throughout the building, and we will set some up in the aisles during Holy Communion. If you are not feeling well, we encourage you to stay at home and participate in the worship service via our live stream which can be found on our Ascension website (<a href="www.alcfdl.org">www.alcfdl.org</a>) or via Facebook (<a href="www.facebook.com/alcfdl">www.facebook.com/alcfdl</a>.) **Know that we will pray for you to get better soon!!!** As we worship, interact, and visit with others around us, it is good to be sensitive to and respectful of the differing comfort levels, practices, situations, and views that we hold.

May God use this time in worship to feed us in our faith and strengthen us for daily service in His name!



# **Word**

First Lesson Acts 8:26-40 p. 1000

<sup>26</sup>Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) <sup>27</sup>So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship <sup>28</sup> and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. <sup>29</sup>Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." <sup>30</sup>So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" <sup>31</sup>He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. <sup>32</sup>Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this: "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. <sup>33</sup>In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth." 34The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" 35Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. <sup>36</sup>As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" <sup>38</sup>He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. <sup>39</sup>When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. 40But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

**Second Lesson** 1 John 4:1-11 p. 1112

Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God; for many false prophets have gone out into the world. <sup>2</sup>By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, <sup>3</sup>and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God. And this is the spirit of the antichrist, of which you have heard that it is coming; and now it is already in the world. <sup>4</sup>Little children, you are from God, and have conquered them; for the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world. <sup>5</sup>They are from the world; therefore what they say is from the world, and the world listens to them. <sup>6</sup>We are from God. Whoever knows God listens to us, and whoever is not from God does not listen to us. From this we know the spirit of truth and the spirit of error. <sup>7</sup>Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. <sup>8</sup>Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. <sup>9</sup>God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. <sup>10</sup>In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. <sup>11</sup>Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another.







# To the Congregation:

- P: I ask you, the people of God, who have now heard the promises of Lauren and her sponsors: Do you in turn promise to be a witness and example of the life to which God calls us? Do you promise to pray for Lauren so that she might grow in her faith and to surround her with a community of love and forgiveness? If so, answer, "We do, and we ask God to help and guide us!"




